

## Notice to Exhibitors

Test/Trial location will be available from 7:00 am to 6:00 pm, or one hour after conclusion of event.

No unentered dogs (except set-out dogs) are allowed at the test/trial site. Limited shade is available. Bring your own canopies. Bath/Cool off tub will be provided. Please bring your own chairs.

Schedule will be provided. Bitches in season will be allowed but will be moved to the end of the class in **test** classes. Please notify the Test/Trial Secretary if your bitch is in season.

ALL AMERICAN KENNEL CLUB RULES REGARDING CONDUCT WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED. No refund for duplicate entries or for any other cause beyond the control of the club after closing of entries.

Returned checks do not constitute a valid entry. NO CONDITIONAL ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED. ENTRY FORMS MUST BE SIGNED.

**Any type of overnight mail must be marked "No signature required."**

A separate entry blank for each class must be completed for each dog entered.

If the dog is being entered in the identical class or classes for both Saturday and Sunday, you may simply check both boxes indicating the day entered. If your dog is entered in a different class each day, please fill out separate entry forms. Entries not on Official AKC Entry Forms and Photocopies of Entry Forms without the 'Current' Agreement and Rules on the reverse side of the Official AKC Entry Forms are NOT ACCEPTABLE. Owners or their agents are solely responsible for the presence of their dog(s) at the test/trial arena.

Judges are not required to wait for dogs. Exhibitors are expected to maintain the premises in a clean and tidy condition. Entry fees shall not be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused by a Veterinarian or Judge or barred from competition by action of the Test/Trial Committee. If, because of riots, civil disturbances, fire, act of God, public emergency or other acts beyond the control of the Club it is impossible to open or to complete the test/trial, no refund of entry fee will be made.

### Exhibitors: Please Note

- ❖ "B" course will have the minimum outruns for each class level.
- ❖ The "A" course sheep arena and the "A" course duck arena will be laid out as in the diagram in the Rules and Regulations.

**Children must be under the supervision of their parent or guardian at all times. Non-compliance with this rule will force the committee to ask them to leave the premises.**

Entries Close: 6:00 pm, Wednesday, September 1, 2010

**Entries open: 8:00 am, Wednesday, July 21, 2010 and will not be accepted prior to that date.**

Total runs limited to 42. B Course Sheep trial runs limited to 4. A Course Sheep trial runs limited to 16. Test runs limited to 16. Duck runs limited to 6. Entries close when numerical limit is reached, or on September 1, 2010, after which time entries cannot be accepted, canceled or substituted. ### Special Trophy Awards

**The Faith Memorial Challenge Trophy, in memory of HC Artisan Starlight HXAs HX, offered by Cindy Mendonca, is awarded to the Bearded Collie Bitch with the highest combined score on sheep earned during the National Event(s) each year until retired, using qualifying scores from A and B courses. The trophy is a hand-painted slice of agate mounted upon wood upon which there is a place for the years and names of the winners. This trophy is offered on a three-time win basis. For permanent possession, this trophy must be won three times at three different National Specialty Herding Event(s), by the same owner, not necessarily with the same bitch.**

**The Boone Memorial Trophy, in memory of Am Can Ch Artison Bronze Paladin HXAs HX, offered by Ann Witte, is awarded annually to the Bearded Collie Dog with the highest combined score on sheep earned during the National Herding Event(s) each year, using qualifying scores from A and B courses. Offered on a limited lifetime basis, individual trophies will be awarded annually for a period of 25 years. The first trophy was awarded at the 2008 National Specialty, with the final trophy being awarded at the 2032 National Specialty. Individual annual trophies are small replicas of a bronze sculpture of a Bearded Collie facing off a Scottish Blackface ram mounted on a wooden base. The original sculpture upon which each year's winner will be recorded, will be displayed at all National Specialties and will remain in the permanent possession of the BCCA.**
